### 2030 deadline for gas monetisation

President Dr Mohamed Irfaan Ali said that Guyana must monetise its gas resources by 2030 and demands that the Stabroek Block, estimated at 17 trillion cubic feet (tcf), be part of a series of mega projects aimed at transforming the Berbice region into an innovation and industrial hub.

The head of state boldly reaffirmed his position while addressing a packed room of local and international investors, technical experts, and global industrial leaders at the inaugural Berbice Development Summit 2025.

The historic two-day event is being held at the Guyana Marriott Hotel in Kingston, Georgetown.

It aims to examine transformative projects that can unleash Berbice's potential as the logistical backbone for future industrialisation and energy distribution in Guyana and the wider region.

Speaking directly to coventurers of the Stabroek Block, the president declared, "I am not willing to push monetisation beyond 2030. Constitutionally, I have an election in 2031, and I can't run again. I'm not leaving this decision for anyone after me. Any option that does not allow this country to monetise gas before 2030 will not have the type of support that I would like to give," he underscored.

The president emphasised the need to create a platform for momentum and unity by partnering with the government and private sector investors.



### **Toronto launches portal for Jamaica aid**

The City of Toronto has launched a new portal to help with disaster relief after Hurricane Melissa tore through Jamaica early last week, Mayor Olivia Chow (pictured) announced at a news conference Friday.

The DonateTO portal includes a way to make secure monetary donations, as well as a list of city firehouses accepting supplies to be shipped to the island.

A host of local businesses are also involved in relief efforts, either helping to collect donations or by donating supplies directly. A tax receipt will be issued for donations of \$20 or more.

"I'm so grateful for the support. Overwhelming isn't a strong enough word to describe it," said David Betty, president of the Jamaican Canadian Association at the news conference, held at Bedessee Imports.

The Caribbean food importer is one of the local businesses helping send hurricane relief to Jamaica.

Bedessee Imports will be shipping 21 tonnes of food and hygiene products to the Island, said CEO Rayman Bedessee, at the news conference.

"Most of our customers are Caribbean-oriented, and they support us greatly, so now it's time for us to go back and support them," said Bedessee.

Melissa made landfall in southwest Jamaica as a Category 5 hurricane two weeks ago, with wind speeds reaching 295 km/h. The hurricane has been blamed for at least 45 deaths in Jamaica and 31 in nearby Haiti.

### OVER 1,500 KM OF CANALS, 300 KOKERS, AND 180 PUMPS TO BE **UPGRADED IN GUYANA'S LARGEST DRAINAGE PROJECT**

Over 1,500 km of canals, 300 kokers, 180 and pumps to be upgraded in Guyana's largest drainage project

President Dr. Mohamed Irfaan Ali has unveiled plans for the largest drainage and irrigation investment in Guyana's history, as part of the government's Low Development Carbon Strategy (LCDS) 2030. The announcement came during the first meeting of the LCDS Multi-Stakeholder Steering Committee (MSSC) for the new term.

The initiative will see upgrades to over 1,500 kilometres of drainage canals, more than 300

Ramirez-Pedermo, Bettancourt, and LaCruz were remanded by Chief Magistrate Faith McGusty. Defense counsel for Boodram argued that his client, a taxi driver, was unaware of the attack, claiming he was merely transporting a passenger.

The remaining three, Pramdeo, Corriea, and Rodriguez, were charged with aiding and abetting and appeared remotely before Leonora Magistrate Alisha **George**, as the alleged acts occurred in East Bank Essequibo. Bail applications for all seven were refused.

Authorities say Ramirez-Pedermo İS linked to the Venezuelan criminal group associated with the Sindicato gang, and **Interpol** is assisting with cross-border verification. Minister of Home Affairs **Oneidge** Walrond credited technology, including the government's Smart City Programme, for the swift arrest of the suspect two days after the attack at Vergenoegen, East Bank Essequibo.

President Dr. Mohamed Irfaan **Ali** condemned the explosion as a "vile act of terrorism," promising families of the victims that "swift justice" will be pursued. Vice President Dr. Bharrat all perpetrators, local or foreign, will face the full weight of the law.

## SETS RECORD STRAIG

The Government of Guyana has clarified details surrounding the Linden-Mabura Road Project after recent international reports described it as a "road nowhere" and questioned its progress and integrity.

A report by The Telegraph (UK) October 2025, 31, claimed that only 46 of the 75 miles of the road had been completed since construction began in December 2022, with challenging sections still pending. Minister of Public Works Bishop Juan A. Edghill shared videos on social media showing ongoing work, addressing what he called "false flags" about the project.

The Minister emphasised that the Linden – Mabura corridor is part of a nearly century-long national development vision. First defined in the 1920s and advanced through the Georgetown-Linden (McKenzie) Lethem Project in the 1960s with U.S. support, the current works modernise and continue that historic strengthening plan, territorial connectivity and national integration.



# OATH-TAKING MARKS ST NADIR RETUR

Guyana's 13th Parliament began its first sitting on Monday, November 13, 2025, at the Arthur Chung Conference Centre (ACCC), with 65 newly elected MPs taking their Oath of Office before Speaker Manzoor Nadir, marking the official start of the legislative session following the September 1, 2025 elections.

#### Nadir Returns as Speaker, Mahadeo Elected Deputy Speaker

Former parliamentarian and minister Manzoor Nadir, an economist by profession, was sworn in as Speaker after being nominated by Prime Minister Brigadier (Ret'd) Mark Phillips and seconded by Minister of Parliamentary Affairs Gail Teixeira. Nadir previously served as Speaker during the 12th Parliament.

Dr. Vishwa Mahadeo, Director General of the Ministry of Health, was elected Deputy Speaker by a majority vote.

#### **Govt Bench Strengthened by Experience and New Faces**

The 36-member PPP/C government bench combines seasoned politicians, professionals, youth, and women. Notable members include Sonia Latchman (Toshao and Vice Chairperson of the National Toshaos Council), Steven Jacobs (Minister within the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sport), Zulfikar Ally (Minister of Public Service), and Keoma Griffith (Minister of Labour, Manpower and Planning). New entrants such as James Bond, Vanessa Benn, Dr. Peter Ramsaroop, and Lennox Shuman bring diverse expertise to the Assembly. Leadership is anchored by Prime Minister Mark Phillips, Vice President Dr. Bharrat Jagdeo, Attorney General Anil Nandlall, SC, and Minister Gail Teixeira, alongside a full roster of ministers overseeing key portfolios.

The opposition benches comprise 29 MPs: 16 from WIN, 12 from APNU, and one from FGM.

### Govt Reports on Natural Resource Fund, Financial Intelligence, and Development Loans

Senior Minister Dr. Ashni Singh presented the Natural Resource Fund (NRF) 2024 Annual Report, underscoring transparency and accountability in managing oil and gas revenues. Reforms under the NRF Act 2021, including the Board of Directors, Public Accountability and Oversight Committee, and Investment Committee, ensure proper governance and parliamentary oversight. The NRF balance as of September 2025 stood at US\$3.6 billion.

Dr. Singh also presented the FIU 2024 Annual Report, highlighting progress in combating money laundering and terrorist financing. Achievements include strengthened AMLCFT laws, establishment of additional regulatory agencies, increased resourcing for enforcement, membership in the Egmont Group of FIUs, and recognition by CFATF with the BREMOLT Case Award.

The sitting also saw the presentation of development loan agreements supporting agriculture, infrastructure, human services, environmental policy reforms, and energy projects. Key agreements include:

- Agricultural and Infrastructural Development Programme (AIDP) US\$15M with CARICOM Development Fund to boost production, processing, and value addition in key commodities, enhance food safety compliance, and strengthen institutional capacity
- Support to Human Services in Guyana II US\$350M with IDB to digitise social safety net services, expand senior citizen pensions, empower persons with disabilities, and advance gender-based programmes
- Environmental Sector Policy-Based Loan US\$125M with CDB to strengthen climate resilience, biodiversity conservation, water resource management, and institutional capacity
- **Gas-to-Energy Project** US\$527M with the U.S. Export-Import Bank to provide reliable, affordable, and cleaner domestic power, reduce carbon footprint, and stimulate economic growth and job creation
- Strengthening Human Capital through Education Project SDR1,690,000 with IDA to enhance secondary education, teacher training, and digital learning.

These loans support Guyana's development agenda while maintaining prudent debt management and sustainability.

The sitting highlighted the PPP/C Government's focus on transparency, accountability, and anti-corruption measures, ensuring that Guyana's natural resource wealth is managed responsibly to benefit current and future generations.
