# **Sod turned for new BK Airport in Bartica**

PRESIDENT Dr Mohamed Irfaan Ali on Sunday described the sod turning for the new BK airport terminal in Bartica as a transformative milestone for Region Seven and another major step in advancing national connectivity, tourism and economic diversification.

Speaking at the ceremony, the head of state said the project reflects "the continuous reinvestment of local wealth back into national development", lauding the BK Group for consistently expanding its footprint and creating new opportunities across Guyana.

"As we turn this sod, we turn a new page for Region Seven," President Ali declared, "Because when we build together, we rise together."

The President underscored that Bartica is undergoing rapid change in line with the government's wider development strategy, noting that the new terminal will become a critical link in opening up the region by air, expanding tourism offerings, lowering transport costs and improving services for communities and

President Ali reminded that Bartica has long been a gateway to the country's hinterland and mining economy, but it is now evolving into a diversified, modern township.

"These are the foundations of a future in which Bartica becomes a destination, not just a passageway," he stated.



# **US Military boss pays visit to Trinidad**

Chairman of the United States (US) Joint Chiefs of Staff General Dan Caine met with Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar and several ministers at the Diplomatic Centre in Port of Spain on Tuesday, as the USA has signalled its intent to raise the stakes against Venezuela in a fight against narco-terrorists.

Following the meeting, statements were promptly issued by both sides. They were however short on details and couched in diplomatic language, leaving Trinidadians to speculate on what really was discussed and what commitments, if any, were made by Government in the midst of heightened tension between the US and Venezuela and with several warships in the region.

The first statement came from the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Public Affairs: "Gen Caine and Prime Minister Persad-Bissessar exchanged views on challenges affecting the Caribbean region, including the destabilising effects of illicit narcotics, arms, and human trafficking, and transnational criminal organisation activities."

It continued, "Gen Caine reaffirmed that the United States remains committed to working closely with Trinidad and Tobago to address shared threats and deepen collaboration across the Caribbean."

The Prime Minister stated that her Government remained committed to addressing the effects of narcotics trafficking, human trafficking and transnational crime for the benefit of citizens and the wider region.

Guyana has recorded a historic achievement for the third year in row: every dollar overpayments in government contracts has been fully recovered. President Dr. Mohamed Irfaan Ali made announcement during a social media address. calling unprecedented accomplishment in the country's financial governance.

"This has never happened before in our country's history," President Ali said. "In 2022, 2023, and now 2024, all overpayments were recovered before the General's Auditor Report was finalised. This is about ensuring taxpayers' money is fully protected and properly used."

The confirmation comes on the heels of the 2024 Auditor General's Report, which examined 829 contracts worth nearly



# New Tourism Zones to Unlock Local Opportunities







# NEW HIGHWAY BRINGS CHANGE TO ECD CORRIDOR

Work is progressing rapidly on the US\$192 million East Coast Demerara Road Expansion, transforming narrow roads into a modern four-lane highway from Sheriff Street, Georgetown, to Orange Nassau.

Communities including LBI, Mon Repos, Annandale, Lusignan, Coldingen, and Nabacalis are benefiting from upgraded access roads, faster commutes, and improved connectivity to schools, clinics, and workplaces.


